Dear Majority Leader Thune and Minority Leader Schumer:

The undersigned producer organizations representing the full range of production across the 17 cotton producing states **strongly oppose Senator Grassley's amendment to the One Big Beautiful Bill Act (OBBBA),** which would greatly weaken the producer safety net.

Specifically, the amendment would dramatically change the structure of farm policy and operational structure by adding language to the OBBBA to impose one payment limit per farming operation and substantially change the definition of what it means for a producer to be actively engaged in farming. In addition, the amendment eliminates the positive improvements made in the OBBBA with regards to payment limits as well as the establishment of equity in treatment of corporations, LLCs, joint ventures, and general partnerships.

Collectively, these changes to the OBBBA will impose massive additional penalties on producers across the country even as they struggle to efficiently manage their operations while contending with a host of challenges – ranging from high input costs to volatile market prices and erratic weather. Since passage of the 2018 farm bill, production costs alone have increased by 25-30 percent since the last farm bill was enacted.

The OBBBA as currently drafted provides the enhancements necessary for our industry to better weather the current economic environment. Without this assurance, many producers will be unable to make the necessary investments to keep their operations viable, and some will abandon farming altogether.

We cannot allow either outcome. For these and other reasons, we again express our strong opposition to the Grassley amendment and respectfully ask you to urge your colleagues to vote against it should it come before the chamber.
